NEWS OF THE FRONTS

To-day's war communiqué reports that the situation in the Sierras has not altered to any great extent. The enemy has made several counter-attacks in the sector of VILLANUEVA DEL PARDILLO; all have been repulsed.

In the same sector our troops cut the road from La Coruña at the point of kilometer 16,500, capturing an enemy encampment with all its material.

Yesterday was another day of victories for our aviation. Besides repeated bombings of enemy positions and troops, our planes succeeded in bringing down twelve enemy machines. We lost only two planes.

NORTH: - Our aviation dispersed many concentrations of enemy troops and carried out important flights of reconnaissance.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

PARIS: - 13th. To-day, at midday, the control of the Franco-Spanish border was withdrawn. The Chief of the International Control has withdrawn all officials to a point some kilometers from the frontier.

BAYONNE: - 13th. The optimists, who had been prophesying an accord between England and Salamanca have once more opened up a campaign against the British Government and especially against its imperialist policy. This attitude is interpreted as a clear proof of the breakdown of any plans which Salamanca had cherished for the recognition by the English Government of Franco as a belligerent. (Argos Press)

The demand of Franco for recognition as a belligerent is receiving little sympathy from the French Press, especially in view of a document recently published here which declares that Franco is demanding of Hitler and Mussolini 125,000 more men and 500 airplanes "in order to avoid new campaigns which may mean the end of the Nationalist Army"

LONDON: - 13th. The "Daily Herald" to-day publishes an article on "Trotskyism" written by William Gallacher. The Editorial Board heads this article with a note underlining the opposition of the British Labour Party towards the Communist Party and yet stating their desire to offer their columns to men of all shades of opinion including communists.

LONDON: 13th. Notices from Pekin show that the Chinese forces continue to harass the Japanese troops in northern China. The latest report states that a battle lasting more than one hour took place near Pekin. At the finish the Japanese troops were forced to retire.

London: 13th. The reporter of the "Daily Telegraph" in the territory held by Franco, to-day comments on the difficulty of obtaining the true facts concerning the events of the last few days in the sector of Brunete, owing to this area being recently closed to all journalists.

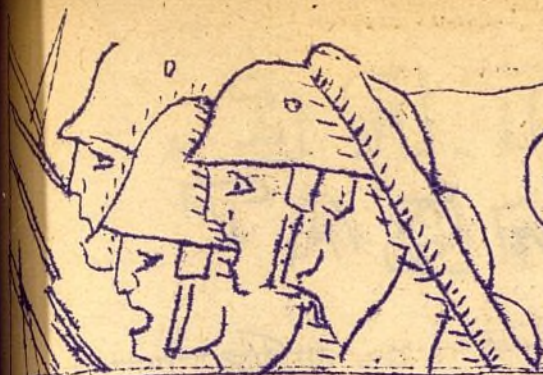

NOTRE COMBAT

COMMUNIQUE DE GUERRE

CENTRE: - Les troupes du sixième corps d'armée coupèrent le front ennemi au kilomètre 16,500 de la route de la Coruña, prenant à l'ennemi les Trenches la principale logne de résistance. On a prit aussi un cantonnement et on lui a infligé de grandes pertes.

La situation n'est pas changée au secteur de la Sierra. On a repoussé énergiquement plusieurs contre-attaques de l'ennemi qui tentait de reconquérir le village de VILLANUEVA DEL PARDILLO.

COMMUNIQUE DE L'AIR

La journée d'hier démontre encore la grande supériorité des ailes de la République. Combats aériens, bombardements intenses des positions ennemies, reconquête approfondie du camp réactionnaire. Tout a été couvert dans les circonstances les plus difficiles, par l'héroïsme de nos pilotes.

Le bilan de la journée reste établi comme suit : Douze appareils ennemis abattus, contre deux de nos perdus.

NOUVELLES ETRANGERES

PARIS: -13. Le Chef du contrôle international à la frontière franco-espagnole, Colonel LUNN, a pris des dispositions pour que les observateurs neutres de la frontière soient disposés à abandonner leur poste et partir à plusieurs kilomètres à l'intérieur de la France.

PARIS: -13. Dans quelques journaux ici on commente encore le fait de que Franco demande la reconnaissance des droits de belligérant au moment de se présenter au public le document dans lequel il demande à Hitler et à Mussolini 125,000 avions et 500 avions "afin d'éviter une campagne qui serait fatale pour l'armée Nationaliste".

BAYONNE: -13. D'après les nouvelles recues du camp rebelle espagnol, les optimistes de la presse fasciste auprès du futur des relations entre Salazar et Angleterre se sont éteintes subitement, et de nouveau les journaux rebelles ont recommencé leur campagne contre la Grande Bretagne relatant principalement ses conquêtes coloniales.

Cette attitude de la presse fasciste s'interprète comme étant la preuve la plus nette de que la manœuvre de Salamanca a échoué complètement, forgée sans doute avec l'appui d'autres chancelleries étrangères, pour rétablir que l'Angleterre au moins reconnaisse le droit de belligérant à Franco.

PARIS: -13. Les journaux annoncent que le propriétaire du "Petit Journal", Patenotre, a vendu ce quotidien au chef fasciste, De La Rocque, pour la somme de neuf millions de francs.

LONDRES: -13. Des nouvelles de Pékin annoncent qu'un combat s'est livré à 100 kilomètres à l'ouest de Pékin.

Le combat dura une heure et les troupes japonaises se retirèrent.

NOUVELLES D'ESPAGNE

CARTEGENA: 14. Le destructeur "Churruca" fit prisonnier le bateau fasciste "Casamitjana" qui transportait rien qu'en sucre 30,000 kilos. Le chargement fut vendu pour la somme de 113,668 pesetas, qui ont été rendues à la Junta Central de Socorro.
